S Problem: increasing pressure on land/ no reliable, comprehensive data


SObjective: Creation of transparency for decision making

S Method: data base, fieldwork, compiling data nation wide (central, provincial and district level), analysis and mapping, reports








Ex. 2: Promotion of inclusive business models, Ethiopia








Ex. 3: Integrated Regional Land Use Planning, Namibia




